

Key Dates

May 25 - Last Day for voters to mail Vote-by-Mail kits via Canada Post to ensure their vote will be counted.

June 3 – Election Day

June 7 - Certification of Results: The County Clerk shall certify the election results prior to 4 p.m.

June 8 – Term of Office Begins: Ward Two Councillor is required to take Oath of Office Prior to taking office.

While Norfolk County encourages voters to return their Vote-by-Mail kit via Canada Post by May 25 for their safety, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, an alternate for submission is to drop off at a designated Ballot drop off location prior to 8:00 pm on June 3, 2021.
