



The Corporation of Norfolk County

By-Law 2016-107

Being a By-Law to Amend By-Law 2016-73, Respecting the Management of the Cemetery owned by Norfolk County, known as Oakwood Cemetery.

AUTHORITY: Funeral, Burial and Cremation Services Act, 2002, S.O. 2002, c. 33

WHEREAS on June 28, 2016 The Corporation of Norfolk County enacted and passed By-Law 2016-73 respecting the management of the Cemetery owned by Norfolk County, known as Oakwood Cemetery;

AND WHEREAS certified copies of By-Law 2016-73 were submitted to the Registrar of the Bereavement Authority of Ontario for approval;

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of Norfolk County now deems it necessary to amend Norfolk County By-Law 2016-73, as required by the Registrar of the Bereavement Authority of Ontario, to ensure compliance with the Funeral, Burial and Cremation Services Act, 2002, S.O. 2002, c.33.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of Norfolk County hereby enacts as follows:

1. That Norfolk County By-Law 2016-73 be amended so that all references to the "Cemeteries Act of 2002" be changed to "Funeral, Burial and Cremation Services Act, 2002 (FBCSA)".
2. That Norfolk County By-Law 2016-73, Article "1.0 Administration; 1.1 Definitions, Section (c) "Care and Maintenance Fund" be amended to read as follows:

"Care and Maintenance Fund" is a requirement under the *Funeral, Burial and Cremation Services Act, 2002* and the contribution to the Care and Maintenance Fund/Account is the greater of \$250 and a percentage of the purchase price of an Interment Right. Set amounts for marker and monument installations is also contributed into Care and Maintenance Fund. Interest earned from this fund is used to provide care and maintenance of graves, plots, markers and monuments at the Cemetery.

3. That the effective date of this By-Law shall be the date of passage thereof.
